Lest We Forget

On Friday 9 November students marked the 100th anniversary of the First World War by paying a special tribute to the fallen soldiers of Areley Kings. Each class individual created poppy wreaths which were laid front of the in memorial board. This memorial was specially commissioned at the end of World War I to remember the 14 soldiers from the village who sadly didn't return home. Students read information about each of the soldiers from a recently published book 'The Story of Areley Kings and World War I'.

The school community was thrilled to have the author of this book, Bill Wood, and his wife Sue, along with members of the local history society, Mr & Mrs Russel, at this special service. Throughout the service and two-minute silence, great respect was shown for such an historic occasion. The wreaths will be incorporated into a special display, both in the school and alongside the memorial to ensure 'we never forget'.

Three Kings Parade

Mrs Watkins said, "We decided this year to replace the previous kings who were well used and showing signs of age. This was all made possible by a grant from Stourport Council and support from Mr Penwarden." The parade was a huge success with the fireworks and carol service being enjoyed by all.

















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Young Mathematicians Award



On Thursday 8 November, 20 students from Wolverley Sebright Primary Academy and Stourport Primary Academy took part in a 'Count me in maths day' at Jaguar Land Rover's i54 Engine Manufacturing Innovation Centre in Wolverhampton.

The event is one of many enhanced learning opportunities organised by SAET in conjunction with the University of Wolverhampton. In addition to a tour of the factory, students took part in a series of activities to develop their maths skills including measuring, calculating, capturing data, analysing data and problem-solving. Maths skills are critical to all elements of the business at Jaguar Land Rover's Manufacturing Centre and students worked together to solve a number of practical maths challenges taken from everyday examples at the factory.


