## School in Focus – Stourport Primary Academy

Stourport Primary This month has been very busy for Stourport Primary - we have lots of budding Academy photographers, a buzz in Year 6, a new build underway and the return of our Crafty Chippies!

#### **Third Space Learning**

Every Wednesday a selection of Year 6 students take part in a computing session called Third Space Learning. After last year's success with this package the school signed up for another year. This is a personal one-to-one experience in which the students have their own specialist maths tutor who they speak to through a headset. Third Space Learning has really created a buzz in Year 6.

The sessions led by the specialist tutors adapt the pitch and pace to each individual child. The interactive sessions last 10 weeks and improvements have been noted in their math skills during this time.

#### **Photography Enrichment**





Recently the students took part in Enrichment lessons. These included cooking, Japanese Language, eco, computing, art and much more.

The Enrichment afternoons have expanded with the addition of photography and dance. In photography, the students use our iPads to take photos in the form of portraits, landscapes, forced prospective, product advertising, separating a photo into thirds and learning about camera ISO settings.

In addition to this, they learn about how the use of light can change how a photograph comes out. They also create their own silhouettes. This has proved a very successful addition to our ever expanding programme of Enrichment.

### **Baxter College Awards Evening**

On Thursday 10 January, Baxter College students celebrated their success at the school's annual awards. GCSE and A-level certificates plus a host of awards for individual achievement were presented by guest speaker, British and world champion cyclist Scott Beaumont.

Here's just a few of the award winners; Ella Marshall, who gained 7 grade 9s, 1 grade 8 and an A\* at GCSE and is now studying A levels at the school, received the Community Housing Group Award for Achievement and the history award. The Jak Crump Award for Achieving Against the Odds went to year 9 student Carolyn Davies and the Sporting Excellence Award was presented to champion swimmer 15-year-old Nathaniel Crowther.

Jack Blazier was rewarded for not having a day's absence for all his seven years at the school with the Kidderminster Educational Foundation Award for Attendance. Even at primary school, he was only absent for two half days. The Lady Eddy Award for Outstanding Service was presented to retired Kidderminster police inspector and Scout Leader Andy Mackillop for 23 years' service to the school as a governor.

Principal Awards went to Daniel Correia – year 13, Ryan Bishop – year 12, Demi Lloyd – year 11, Jake Whitaker – year 10, Benjamin Weatherstone – year 9, William Edney – year 8, Emily Bloor and Tegan Nightingale – year 7. The Award for Literacy went to year 8 pupil James Ratcliff. More than a dozen students achieved Duke of Edinburgh awards, with silver achieved by Katherine Aston, Katy Cadwallader, Macy Hearn, Joseph Hill, Katie Mann and Charlie-Katie Willott.

## Congratulations to Wolverley and Wilden who ranked top 10 in Worcestershire

Well done to pupils in all our primary schools following the recently published validated data from 2018. There were many individual successes in all Trust primaries with pupils extremely well prepared to start their secondary education mentally, physically and academically.

We are very pleased that Wolverley Sebright Primary Academy and Wilden All Saints CE Primary have both been ranked in the top 10 highest performing state primary schools in Worcestershire in The Sunday Times rankings. Recently validated primary school league table data for England identified that an average of 64% of pupils in England met the expected standard last year in reading, writing and maths with 10% meeting the higher standard. Wolverley Sebright came out on top in the County with 94% reaching the expected standard and Wilden All Saints 85% and Hartlebury CE Primary 82%. Moreover, 27% of pupils at Wilden All Saints achieved at a higher standard and 18% at Wolverley Sebright. In reading, Wolverley Sebright were top in Worcestershire and also 'well above average' in maths. Wilden All Saints were 'well above average' in writing alongside Stourport Primary Academy.



### **Post 16 Success**

Congratulations to everyone involved with post 16 education at SHS and Baxter College. There were considerable individual successes within both schools.

Results from the summer place Stourport VI<sup>th</sup> Form 7<sup>th</sup> out of 51 sixth forms in Worcestershire for value added which is a fantastic achievement. If you discount independent schools SHS is 3<sup>rd</sup> in the County. Post 16 provision at both Baxter College and SHS is not just about exam success, although it is important as it opens doors for students and gives them a wide range of options. Students accessing sixth form provision within the trust also receive excellent support and guidance and have the opportunity to access a wide range of activities and experiences that help them in becoming well rounded young adults.

Colleagues at Baxter College are busily preparing to be part of the pilot Ofsted inspections taking place during the spring and summer terms. The school has volunteered to work with Ofsted as they undertake pilot inspections using the new framework in schools around England. This is a great opportunity for Baxter staff to work closely with HMI and an inspection team in a collaborative way, and to receive feedback on the progress the school has made since it was last inspected in 2015. The pilot inspection will take place sometime between March and June.

As part of this, Year 12 and 13 students were involved in a talk about apprenticeships. Year 13 are taking part in cooking sessions to prepare them for University.

#### **Students talk Apprenticeships**


