



## PE and Sport Premium 2018 - 2019



### INTENTION

- To develop the PE, physical activity and sport activities that the school already offers
- Build children's confidence and increase their enjoyment of sport through offering a range of activities

### Schools can use the premium to secure improvements in the following indicators:

- 1 The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- 2 The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- 3 Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4 Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5 Increased participation in competitive sport

Funding for 2018 – 2019      £16000 plus an additional £10 per pupil from year 1 to year 6 totalling £17610
