

SHS's Cheick K named PLAY Achiever of the Year 2019

SHS student Cheick K was named the PLAY Achiever of the Year for 2019 at the Premiership Rugby Parliamentary Community Awards. Cheick played rugby for 5 months and has since been picked by Worcester Warriors, for whom he has now played for 7 months. So after only playing the sport for 12 months he spoke of life before rugby, in wartorn Cote d'Ivoire. He left there with his father and remains in touch with his Grandmother and Mother via phone.

He began his rugby journey by initially playing football but soon turned to rugby and began playing for Wolverhampton RFC.

Cheick said: "I used to play football. But when I started playing rugby, I didn't realise how many more friends it was going to get me. Everyone was educated and they respected people – it wasn't like football. If you don't know how to do something [in rugby] they will help you out, but in football they will mock you. I wanted to be a mechanic when I was at school. But when I found out about rugby I just decided to focus on that, to become the best rugby player I can. I enjoy it."

Cheick attends Stourport High School & Sixth Form College, Worcester's partner AASE school, who have been "fantastic" in their understanding of his complex educational, sporting and familial requirements.

It's been a busy term for our Year 10 Community Ambassadors from Stourport High School and Baxter College. They involved themselves in the West Mercia Police's campaign 'Operation Sceptre' raising awareness of the consequences and dangers of carrying a knife. This was followed by Halloween, firework and personal safety advice through assemblies and information stands giving away products that could help keep students safe, such as reflective tags for their bags or stickers that glow in the dark.

During National Anti-Bullying week, Stourport Community Ambassadors worked with tutor groups to come up with their own anti-bullying pledges and these are on display in their Student Reception.
