


Spring Term 2 also saw the start of SHS's Young Enterprise business 'Bee Kind' who later went on to win the Sustainability Award and the Best Finance Award too! Also, Baxter College received the Silver Award for their mental health provision. Baxter College has also developed a positive relationship working group to benefit teaching and learning and liaises closely with external services and the NHS's Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services.

Wilden All Saints were recognised nationally in the BBC Wildlife Magazine for their excellent forest school curriculum. Specially trained teacher Mrs Mason ran weekly sessions for 30 4-and-5-year olds learning in an area of woodland.

Figures revealed SHS's A-level results in 2019 topped the league table in Wyre Forest, with students making the best progress and the highest average grade across three A-levels. Highlights included 100% pass rates at grades A* to C for students in fine art, English literature, history, religious studies, geography, film studies, media studies and business studies. Government statistics show a year on year improvement in progress for the school's sixth form since 2017 following the opening of the £3.5 million state-of-the-art sixth form college.
