Who can I talk to if I am concerned about my child's attendance or punctuality?

We encourage all parents/carers to talk to us if you are worried about your child's attendance. You can speak to Miss Gledhill or Mrs Fudge in the school office, Mrs Bartlett, Mrs Unitt or your child's class teacher, who will all be happy to help you.

What is a Penalty Notice?

A penalty notice is a fine issued by the Local Authority for failing to secure regular attendance to school or for removing your child for a holiday during term time. The fine is £120 per parent, per child, reducing to £60 if paid within 21 days.

What will happen if I am prosecuted for non-attendance?

The Local Authority will issue either a penalty notice fine or commence proceedings in the magistrates court which could result in a fine of up to £1000 per parent.

Education is key to your child's future successes, it is important to resolve any issues as quickly as possible.

Why is attending school every day important?

Good attendance gives your child the opportunity to achieve their full potential as well as developing important life skills. Regularly attending school means attending at least 96% of the time or missing no more than one day per half term.

What to do if your child needs to be absent from school:

If your child is genuinely too unwell for school, please contact the school office before 8.30am daily to notify us of the reason for absence and their expected date of return. If there is another reason for their absence, please discuss with us and we will advise of the appropriate registration mark.

What is an unauthorised absence?

An unauthorised absence is an absence the school does not deem as essential or reasonable. For example; family trips, birthdays, caring for siblings or oversleeping. These absences will be recorded in line with the schools Attendance Policy.

What to do if your child has a medical appointment during the school day

Please advise the school office by phone or email and advise them of the appointment time including what time your child will arrive/be collected to/from school. We would encourage all parents/carers to make appointment outside of school hours where possible.

What to do if your child has a medical condition that can prevent regular attendance:

We want to support all pupils to enable them to access a full education. We will work closely with you and other professionals to ensure your child receives the correct support whilst in school. An individual health care plan may be put in place if necessary.

Can I take my child out of school for a family holiday?

Holidays during term time are NOT authorised. Parents who remove their child for a holiday could face a penalty notice fine of £120 per parent per child. A Leave of Absence Request Form is available from the school office. This must be completed and returned before your child can be absent due to a family holiday.



What will happen if my child's attendance becomes a cause for concern?

Mrs Bartlett or Mrs Unitt will write to you initially. If there is no improvement in your child's attendance, you will be invited to attend a meeting to work together to help your child's attendance improve. Any further unauthorised absences, could result in legal action being taken by the local authority. This could include a penalty notice fine.

What to do if your child refuses to attend school?

We are here to help! Talk to your child to establish if there are any reasons for non-attendance. Very often they could be experiencing friendship issues, have a lesson that they don't enjoy or may be feeling anxious about something. Talking to them at their eye level and trying to understand their reasons will ensure we can act on this in the most appropriate way.
