We had a wonderful day on Tuesday 16th January when we were honoured by a visit from the Right Reverend, Bishop of Worcester, John Inge. The Bishop blessed our new Reflection and Prayer Space which has been created by the pupils themselves. Bishop John took part in a whole school act of worship, hearing about the school's new vision and the difference that the space will make to the children. Bishop John said: "I am delighted to be here to bless this new space as well as the whole school and all who are a part of it. Prayer is a fantastic gift that God has given us. It enables us to extend our care and concern for others across the miles. I hope that you will use this space to feel God close to you and also to bring other people to God in prayer."

The school has been supported by parent and Chair of the PTA Alex Jolly to transform the space. Alex said: "It was great to transform a white, uninspiring space into something more exciting for the children to use for reflection. We reflected the school's vision that everyone is a unique child known to God by helping the children paint their handprints on the space. We also thought about joy, hope and prayer and explored different symbols of Christianity. The children then designed prints which we printed onto fabric and turned into a curtain. The designs from children in early years were turned into a cushion and blanket."

Children's Mental Health Week - Monday 5th February - Sunday 11th February


