PUPIL ENGAGEMENT RESULTS

Last term our Key Stage 2 pupils took part in a Trust commissioned survey, delivered through the ImpactEd Group, focusing on pupil engagement. High pupil engagement is a lead indicator of good attendance, good progress and positive school experience. Our report has been released and we are delighted by the children's responses. Areas covered include enjoyment, inclusion, peer and teacher relationships, behaviour, effort, agency and drive. Our results are higher than national average and high comparitively across the Trust. Please find below the statement results from our children, all of whom from Years 3-6 took part.

In that time he has been Birmingham's Poet Laureate (2006/7), performed at Glastonbury Festival and Cheltenham Literature Festival to name just two of many and has facilitated poetry workshops at hundreds of schools, both in the UK and abroad. He has also been commissioned by the BBC on several occasions and even popped up on The One Show.

His enthusiasm for the spoken and written word, as well as his previous victories in Slam Poetry competitions ensure he is able to excite even the most reluctant reader about poetry.




Spoz's Shorts... and the Occasional Long One






The Sigil of Semjaza




Project Wormhole (Planet of the Dinosaurs 1)
